

US TSCA PBT statement

On January 6, 2021, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) has issued five final rules to reduce exposures to certain chemicals that are persistent, bioaccumulative and toxic (PBT), as required under Section 6(h) of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA). Any company operating, importing, or selling into the U.S. must restrict the use of the following five PBT substances in their product.

PBT Substance Name	CAS Number	Restriction Threshold
Phenol, isopropylated phosphate (3:1) (PIP (3:1))	68937-41-7	No amount permitted
Decabromodiphenyl ether (DecaBDE)	1163-19-5	No amount permitted
2,4,6-tris(tert-butyl)phenol (2,4,6 TTBP)	732-26-3	0.3% at product or mixture level
Hexachlorobutadiene (HCBD)	87-68-3	No amount permitted
Pentachlorothiophenol (PCTP)	133-49-3	1% at product or mixture level
